EAL/ESOL LANGUAGE TESTING ACROSS DDLETB

English language testing has taken place so far this term in 24 DDLETB venues (Colleges of FE, Adult Education Centres and post primary schools) sometimes over 2 days using the adaptive online Cambridge English Placement test to ensure students get accurate and reliable 1:1 feedback on where they are with their English language skills and to ensure they know how to improve. A report is sent home to parents so they know the work being done to track and monitor language development in DDLETB schools. The data can be used for School Self Evaluation, to identify learning loss and focus on wellbeing.

The **reading competition** for EAL students across DDLETB post primary schools is taking place again this term. Data generated from online testing has helped to identify very worthy candidates so far from St Finian's CC, Griffeen CC, Rath Dara CC, Balbriggan CC (a student who transferred to Skerries CC), Kishoge CC, St Kevin's CC. In the coming weeks, more students who have put in a big effort to improve their language skills in the last year will no doubt be identified and put forward for the competition. Prizes will be given out the week before the Christmas break.

Cambridge exams

(B1 Preliminary and B2 First) were held over lockdown - in July 2020 and May 2021 and will be held again in May 2022. Please give priority to the language learning of EAL students in TY. In this way, they can reach their potential in senior cycle and leave our schools with choices. Students in TY and 6th year do not pay exam fees for this internationally-recognised certification.

Universal Design for Learning - UDL Badge Supporting ALL in the classroom.

This term sees the rollout of our UDL digital badge course, developed with the National Forum for the Enhancement of Teaching & Learning, AHEAD and UCD Access & Lifelong Learning. The 10-week online course will provide you with a strong introduction to the Universal Design for Learning Framework and give you the opportunity to implement UDL approaches within the teaching activities you are currently undertaking.

What: 10 week Introductory course on Universal Design for Learning.
When: Nov 29th – Mar 2nd. General registration opens Nov 8th – 20th.
Course Structure: The course is made up of three key elements.

1.5 short online modules building UDL knowledge

and encouraging self-reflection + resources to explore

- Introducing Universal Design for Learning
- Examining Multiple Means of Engagement the 'why' of learning
- · Examining Multiple Means of Representation the 'what' of learning
- · Examining Multiple Means of Action and Expression the 'how' of learning
- · Reflecting On Your Practice

2. Group interactions with peers (either through a workshop format or via ongoing groups of three known as Peer Triads)

- Exploring the diversity in your school
- · Looking at how UDL can help to reduce barriers to learning
- · Discussion and brainstorming on how you can change your practice with UDL
- 3. UDL Redesign Activity
- · Select a teaching activity you will deliver during the course (class/CBA/project/assignment)
- Redesign at least one aspect of the module using UDL principles (e.g. assessment, teaching materials, classroom resources, student activities etc.)
- · Implement and deliver the redesigned activity
- Produce a short report (written or video) on the process of the redesign and implementation - both your experiences and your students
