Scoil Choilm have been working as Scientists again!

Ms Maher's Fifth Class participated in the Primary Science Fair in the RDS. The Primary Science Fair takes place alongside the BT Young Scientist & Technology Exhibition. It encourages primary school aged children to develop their interest in science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) in a non-competitive environment.

Ms Maher's Fifth Class carried out 'A Comparative Sugar Content Study of Supermarket Own Brand Breakfast Cereals'. They began their research by surveying the favourite cereals of their peers. They discovered that the preferred breakfast cereals in their class were 'Cornflakes', 'Coco Pops', and 'Crunchy Nut'. They then measured out how much sugar each cereal contained and compared it with the same cereal from other supermarkets. 'Cornflakes', 'Coco Pops' and 'Crunchy Nut' from Lidl, Aldi, Tesco, Dunnes and SuperValu were all analysed and compared.

The results were shocking! The sugar content in cereals varies greatly in supermarket own brand breakfast cereals. Cornflakes from Lidl contain 1.3g of sugar whereas Cornflakes from Dunnes Stores contain 6.1g of sugar. The class created posters to present their findings in the RDS.

On the morning of the Primary Science Fair, the children arrived at school early. They travelled by bus to the RDS and set up their stand. The RDS was filled with young Scientists presenting their findings from their experiments.

The children attended Science shows, chatted to visitors to the Science fair, explained their experiment to judges, met with An Garda Síochána and the Irish Coast Guards and explored lots of other Science projects. The judges had lots of questions and were very impressed with the children's work. Ms Maher's Fifth Class had a great day at the Primary Science Fair and Scoil Choilm has already began researching for next year!

The Role of School Chaplaincy

There was a man in the 4th century named Martin. When Martin was 15 years old he was forced to join the army of the occupying Roman Empire in France. One day he saw a beggar freezing in the cold, so Martin moved by compassion, removed his cloak and cut it in half.

He gave half to the beggar and kept half of the cloak. Martin became a Christian in the years that followed. Martin's half of the cloak became a precious relic, a representation of compassion and of protecting that which is sacred. The guardian of the cloak was called the Capellanus, this word was translated to English as Chaplain.

Today the Chaplain still represents compassion and protects that which is sacred. DDLETB schools are multidenominational, therefore Chaplains seek to protect and encourage students to develop their own spirituality. Spirituality is how people understand themselves and the world they live in, it is how they relate to others and for some, how they relate to a deity.

Chaplains contribute to the holistic development of students, so that they have the skills to understand their own wellbeing and can manage their emotional, mental, physical, and spiritual needs. Chaplains are champions for spiritual development, through retreats, providing prayer spaces, facilitating meditations, and arranging faith-based activities across all faiths.

Chaplains play a great role in helping students to foster a sense of belonging and unity within our diverse communities in schools. This is done by marking different faith holidays or celebrations. Chaplains also highlight the connection points of people of different faiths and those with none, to promote respect and community.

Chaplains work as part of a wider caring community in schools. Much of a Chaplain's time is spent providing one to one emotional support to students and staff. This is done through compassionate listening, by providing a safe space for students to rest and reflect and by accompanying students and staff through the ups and downs of life.

The role of the school Chaplain is a very valuable one to the whole school community working with students, staff and parents to foster a sense of belonging and espousing the core values of DDLETB schools through Respect, Community, Equality, Excellence in Education and Care.

Digital Media Team



I was invited by Special Olympics to speak in the Oireachtas on the International Day for people with disabilities in2020. I also participated in the advertisement for the DSS (Decision Support Service) which is on T.V. and radio. I have been part of research, both as a participant and as a researcher with Inclusion Ireland, TU Dublin, Trinity and Special Olympics USA.

Dublin and Dún Laoghaire ETB Week Alumni Carolina Vitnem

Carolina came to Ireland as a refugee from Angola 22 years ago when she was 23. She is an Irish citizen since 2013. In Angola, Carolina had attended second level school, but she had no English at all when she came to Ireland. Her first language is Portuguese.

She has lived in Balbriggan since 2008 and became a student of the DDLETB Adult Education Service in Balbriggan in 2011. Initially she did some part time courses in English and ICT. She then joined a full-time programme and in time she completed a L4 major award and progressed to a L5 major award in the DDLETB Adult Education Service. After completing her L5 programme she applied to DIT Cathal Brugha Street as it was known at the time, but her application was unsuccessful. She continued to attend English classes with the Adult Education Service Balbriggan and her DDLETB tutor supported her to apply for the degree in Culinary Arts again. Her second application was successful, and she began her degree in 2016, graduating during the pandemic in 2020.

She gained employment in the catering sector before working as a chef on the "Healthy Food Made Easy" project. She was then recruited to teach in the Community Education Service which is part of the DDLETB Adult Education Service Balbriggan. Carolina is a passionate, knowledgeable and patient teacher, taking care to ensure that her classes are well prepared and suitable for the level and skill set of the groups that she is teaching. The Community Education Service works with a range of community partners including Prosper Fingal. Prosper Fingal provides services and supports to adults with an intellectual disability. Carolina teaches a group of young adults with intellectual disabilities how to cook simple healthy dishes and stay healthy. Also, through Community Education Service she works with Cairde which is a community group and teaches cookery and baking skills to a group of Irish and African women in the Cairdre Balbriggan Community Centre.

Carolina still attends English language classes in the evening to improve her own standard of English. Her three children were born in Ireland. The eldest of them went to Balbriggan Community College and is now in university. The second child achieved an A in Irish in the Leaving Cert and is also in UCD and her youngest is currently a student in Ardgillan Community College. Carolina was nominated by the manager of the Community Education Service for the Alumni Award because Carolina is a great example of how FET provides a bridge to new possibilities for learners. She came to Ireland with no English and has worked hard to get a degree and has now gone on to teach others, particularly disadvantaged cohorts, through the DDLETB Adult Education Service Balbriggan.

DDLETB were delighted to nominate Carolina for the ETB Alumni award and we were proud to celebrate with her at the ETB Day Ceremony in Thomond Park.



"In November 2022 the school community at Deansrath Community College were devastated by the loss of First Year student Jacob Perkins. Jacob was a charismatic and inspiring boy who brought laughter and happiness into the life of everyone he interacted with. Sadly, Jacob was diagnosed with a rare form of bone cancer earlier that year and received a terminal diagnosis. Jacob refused to let his illness prevent him from inspiring others and he bravely fronted a campaign for World Childhood Cancer month raising thousands of euro in the process for charity.

Jacob's friends, many of who he attended primary school with wanted to create a permanent tribute to him in school so the Parents' Association offered to sponsor a friendship bench. The friendship or 'buddy bench' evolved into a community project as ever-reliable school caretaker Brendan Nestor sourced materials and was ably assisted by his father, Eamonn from Lucan Men's Shed to design and construct the bench. The younger members of the Nestor family even assisted by helping to transport and deliver the bench!

Finally, some of Jacob's classmates guided by talented Art teacher Ciara Skehan painted and added some finishing touches before it was put on display last week to the delight of the now Second Year students. It is hoped the bench will serve as a lasting legacy to Jacob under the motto "some friendships are timeless."

Priory Youthreach News Silver Health HQ Mark

Priory Youthreach were extremely proud to accept the Silver Health Quality (HQ) Mark from the National Youth Council of Ireland (NYCI). The HQ Mark is a recognition of quality standards in youth health promotion, awarded to organisations who meet specified criteria.

The NYCI have developed twelve criteria that demonstrates best practice in health promotion and has designed many of these criteria based on those established by the World Health Organization (WHO) for the Health Promoting Schools Initiative. As a result, organisations can achieve varying levels of the HQ Mark – bronze, silver, and gold – when some or all criteria are met. Priory Youthreach will receive their gold HQ Mark in May 2024 to coincide with their annual graduation ceremony.
